Service Dog Rights & Etiquette :

- Service dog teams are not required by law to show identification cards.
- Dogs in training are handled by people with disabilities who may request accommodation, with the same legal rights to access as fully trained teams.
- Businesses have the right to ask handlers to remove their dog if it becomes disruptive, such as through repeated barking, interfering with customers, or being out of control. This is considered "undue hardship" and is fully supported by our program.
